A few months ago, my message discussed losing site of **PRESERVATION** when we rebranded as the *Barbershop Harmony Society (BHS)*. Today let's consider the other lost word – the key to preserving our barbershop style - **ENCOURAGEMENT**. Encouragement goes straight to the heart. In fact, the word itself comes from a combination of the prefix *en* which means "to put into" and the Latin root *cor* which means "heart."

We as a chapter, being part of the society, can do things to encourage our members, providing services and programs to help each member be more successful in their barbershop experience.

- Creating chapter meetings that have a musical and social element
- Encouraging members to attend conventions to inspire us musically and expand our social group worldwide
- Offering a Pole Cat program that gives us all a universal song sheet
- Providing a plethora of music available to a chapter music team or individual members
- Participating in contests at different performance levels to allow each member to compete in a friendly manner & providing opportunities to learn and improve
- Sharing the latest in opportunities at Harmony University and web pages to learn music using the barbershop style

Those aren't things that prospective members are aware of – they are something we need to introduce them to. And even then, it often requires members to pursue the activities.

We need to be more personal in our encouragement. This barbershop hobby is about working together to make music. 


