THE VIEW FROM THE HELM

A YEAR THAT MAY BE LONG REMEMBERED — ISSUE 25

Eighty years ago, there were plans being made to defeat the Axis Powers. Part of those plans were discussed in the recently liberated Tehran, Iran in November 1943 by the leaders of the Allies (Churchill, Stalin and FDR). The idea would be a May invasion of France. As we know, the weather didn't allow that plan to occur until June. The amount of planning and logistical readiness for D-Day would take from November until May. Seems like a long time, but as we prepare for our own 'invasion' of France next June, I think you can sense the anxiety those of us in administration may have. Kitty sent some of us a count-down clock for June 4, our D-Day, and it is 168 days away - feels a lot closer than that.

As we look at 2024, there is a lot ahead of us. It will be just a couple of weeks and we will have hosted the Novice Quartet Contest for Northern California and hopefully delivered a goodly number of Singing Valentines (I reiterate the need for you who still work to ask for 2/14 off, at least half a day). We have collectively agreed to compete in the FWD Spring/NorCal Division Contest in Fremont, CA, March 16. We will have our Annual Show Saturday April 27. These things we know for sure to occur before we leave for the airport.

There will be some upcoming special rehearsals, that I fully expect each and every one of the Normandy participants to attend. I have talked about quartet sound gel, but there is also a bit of that in chorus sound – a goodly portion of that is balance and voice placement.

It wasn't that long ago, that I would have thought that that would be bordering on too much for us to handle. With the things we have done and the positive vibes I get as we do them, I know that we are more than capable of doing this and more.

I have asked before, are you excited? But now I want to know, are you engaged? Meaning, are you committed and confident that we (and more significantly you) can do this? Do you fully understand your role in all these things? Are you ready to lean a little outside your comfort zone?

No matter how things go on February 10th, February 14th, March 16th and/or April 27th, the trip to France will be something that we will talk about all our lives. The key is to make all the stories be stories of goodness and satisfaction and not of what could have been. So as the Harbor Pilot, I encourage your Captain (Bill) and the Leadership (the Music Team specifically) to work the crew (that would be us – the chorus) hard.

By the next 'View' I will write, there will have been a number of folks recognized for their efforts to support the Chapter in 2023, but I can tell you that each and every one of them are key to where we are right now and where we will be in the future – and that future is bright.

Musical Director's Message:

Happy New Year!!! 2023 was a great year for the Portsmen with wonderful chorus performances and many members finding ways to quartet.

My new year's resolution for the chorus ... I guess it would be more of a wish since I can't control the feelings and emotions of the membership, is that we can all get to that place where we find joy and confidence in our singing.

When I get together to sing with my quartet, it usually takes a while before I'm warmed up vocally and emotionally. I see that with the chorus, too. Sometimes it can take half of the rehearsal for us to let go of the things that stress us and feeling the lack of joy of the people around us.

When I visited the Mean Time Chorus in London last summer, I was shocked at how long their warmup time was – about 45 minutes. I think they do that to make sure when they sing the first note together as a chorus that they are all ready to make music. They would partner up in groups of 2 or 3 and work through a routine that included:

- Physical stretching to allow their bodies to become a singing instrument
- Chatting with other members to release the stresses of life
- Deep breathing exercises to reestablish the air flow needed for good singing
- Soft singing with back pressure using a singing straw or a cup
- Singing scales and intervals to match pitch and harmonize short phrases
- Finally, they would group together to sing a new tag to harmonize and think as a group
- As they learned the new tag, they would share their thoughts and emotions about the process

I personally have had mixed emotions about how to warm up. Sometimes I can just jump right in and other times it seems like I never find that confident edge during the rehearsal.

The thing that I do know is that, when I find that confident place is when music starts being created and everyone involved starts to have a good time.

As you're singing a song find that confident control by:

- Seeing yourself as a singer ready to communicate
- Thinking about the words of the next phrase so you are ready to deliver them
- Taking a confident preparatory breath before each phrase
- Making sure your face and body are expressing emotion
- Listening to your ensemble and adjusting as needed
- Cherishing the moments you make Appreciating what the members next to you are doing
- Being grateful for the performance you create

Back to the new year's resolution. Develop a warmup routine that works for you. Do some physical and mental preparation on the way to rehearsal so that we can start making music with the first notes we sing together.


