ARE YOU ON YOUR TOES? - ISSUE 34

Donna and I enjoy watching 'Dancing with the Stars' each year, not because we are dancers ourselves, but the whole thing of music, moves and competition is just enjoyable. One of the



things that always stands out to me is how the celebrity males are usually not on their toes as they dance. The greatest reason is the fact that that posture exhibits positive energy forward toward the audience. It is a position of confidence, not always a statement of what you feel – but what you need to share with those watching. That is something that many non-acting participants must learn during the show.

As respects to Riverside there are those that expressed concern of our placement during the contest, between the 'Masters of Harmony' and "Harmonia' from Fog City – an International Champion and likely an International perennial competitor, but we could have something for them too. Now do I believe that we could score higher than them. No, it would be a miracle if we did – but if we were on our toes and told the story of Jake and why he should understand why he should know "how lucky" he is, we will do more than okay.

But this is more than what we are doing for October 19, 2024. Will we do the same for the Folsom Show the following Wednesday? Doesn't the Folsom audience deserve the same? The story of those that lived to remember the early days of World War II through it's end that the "White Cliffs of Dover" share is very impactful. In 2024, such a story is fictional, but to those that 'he remembers well, "as the shadows fell," it was oh too real.

There are lots of reasons why this song can hit a chord to anyone in the audience, especially those that make up our Barbershop family, for many have a relationship to someone who was there during the war or never came home. A big impact could be felt by those that have no connection to the war, just based on how we present the words.

So, are you expecting to be on your toes as we present the impactful message of 'Dover' or on the uplifting message that no matter who or where you are, you are so lucky to be here in America, in the Barbershop Harmony Society, and participating in a Chorus Contest or Chapter Show?

But the bigger question has nothing to do with those two songs, rather about how do you see yourself in any song that YOU present to any audience? Are you on your toes or heals, can you push beyond any insecurities and put them behind you presenting a character that exudes positivity from your toes?

There are things that boggle the mind when it comes to performing, being on your toes and displaying energy is one of them. Another is the fact that, after we enter puberty, we tend to take deep breaths. when standing, by raising our shoulders instead of expanding our bellies as we would when lying flat on the floor. Our self-awareness adversely effects our outward performances. Funny, it seems that the more comfortable we become with our outward performances, the more we lose our self-awareness or comfort.

Recently I watched an interview with Steve Perry of Journey, where he confided that he quit singing as a response to the fact that he lost the 'thrill of performing' and realized his decent into drugs and such was hurting more than helping and he knew that activity couldn't continue – both for his audiences and for his personal health. There must be something about that, as the number of musical stars that have succumbed to 'mood enhancers' is astounding.

So I go back to the question, are you on your toes, ready to confidently show what you can do as a part of our ensemble. We are always better when each of us can stand on our own.

- 6. There are past champion shows featuring the best quartets in the region that you will become familiar with the longer you are in the society. The Far Western District offering is called "The AFWDC Late Show". Note that if you're interested in attending this is addition cost but well worth the price.

#### **AFWDC Late Show**

The Association of Far Western District Champions (AFWDC) presents a spectacular parade of past FWD champion quartets following the Friday evening Quartet Semifinal at the Fall Convention. Champion quartets of the past are invited to "strut their stuff". Some sing only a one-song cameo while the current, active quartets will sing a full set. The show traditionally closes with our current champs singing their "swan song".

A Friday night tradition, and one we're sure you'll not want to miss!

- 7. Consider singing in the *Everyone Welcome Chorus* that fills the role as mic tester chorus if time permits.
- 8. Be on the lookout for new special choruses made up of seniors or groups that want to sing in a highly competitive chorus that you can be a part of.
- 9. The *Chorus Contest* is why many of you will attend because you are part of a competing chorus. Try to see other choruses before or after your chorus performs (though sometimes that is difficult to fit in). Fortunately, the top choruses will get to sing again on *The Show of Champions*.
- 10. Plan a meal with friends from your quartet, chorus, or people around the globe. It's a great chance to get together with old friends or even new friends.
- 11. Quartet Finals is a special chance to see the best of the best. Be sure to attend.
- 12. The Show of Champions gives you one last look at all the winners. Sometimes it will be your only chance to see them since you might be competing right before or after them.
- 13. Attending a formal afterglow or making one with friends is a great way to finish up the evening. You'll get to see all sorts of different groups that may or may not have competed.
- 14. Find (or host) a hospitality suite. This is a great way to get the quartets to come to you as a parade of quartets will stop by to sing for you in a closer intimate surrounding.
- 15. ALWAYS be ready to sing a tag or a song with someone in the hallway. Spontaneous moments to sing will happen at any time during a barbershop event. When you see three other people offer to be a fourth or invite others to sing a song or tag with a group you are spending time with. Sometimes these opportunities to sing with the best quartets happens very late at night since quartets have a review session with the judges before they can get out and party with everyone.

Be flexible with your time and expectations. Make time to share the experience with people you know. Be bold and step out and meet someone new. There is so much more to the contests/conventions than the 6 minutes your chorus will spend competing on stage. And please sing a tag with me.....


