
Musical Director's Message:

How to Be a Better Musician (and a Decent Human While You're At It)

This month, let's talk about something that hits a little deeper than tuning the tag or nailing choreo on that tricky uptune ending. Sure, we're all here to make great music—but if we're honest, the journey to becoming a better singer often runs right alongside becoming a better human. And it turns out, the two go hand in hand (or note in note, if you will).

Let's start with the basics: discipline gets you to rehearsal on time while still learning your part from that warbly old learning track on the drive over. **Patience** is how we survive singing the same song for hours at a time without tossing a pitch pipe at someone especially the one guy in the back row who still can't find the downbeat. And humility? That's what keeps us open to feedback (even when it comes with a raised eyebrow from the bass section).



Listening is everything—whether it's tuning that pesky chord or hearing your lead without stomping all over them. **Thoughtfulness** shows up in a well-placed breath, a clean cutoff, or helping a newer member learn their part without making them feel like they're in a musical interrogation. **Practice**—yes, even outside of rehearsal, keeps us sharp. Show up knowing your notes. Practice your vowels. Practice not being annoying. And **honesty**, well, that's just knowing when you were the one who scooped the note and being okay with owning it.

Don't forget the big ones: **love** and **heartbreak**. Love fuels the music. Love the music, love the people, love the process—even when it involves endless discussions about vowel targets and hand placement. Heartbreak sneaks into barbershop too. Maybe a quartet breaks up. Maybe you let that trophy slip away. Maybe you miss someone who used to sing beside you. Heartbreak deepens your sound. It adds weight to the ballads and bite to the uptunes. You can hear when someone's singing from experience, and it hits differently. And please—for the rhythm's sake—**don't clap on 1 and 3**. Just don't. If you don't know why, ask a baritone. Feel the groove. Respect the backbeat. If you must clap, make it musical. Better yet, snap like a smooth baritone on a swing tag.

Now, for the singers in the house (ahem, that's all of us), let's not forget the *craft*. As a singer, scales and arpeggios might not sound sexy—but they are absolutely your best friends. Want to hit that high G without sounding like a goose in a wind tunnel? **Scales**. Want your runs to sound intentional and not like a slip on a wet sidewalk? **Arpeggios**. **Chords**? That's the whole dang point of barbershop—get to know them inside and out. Understand how your part fits. Hear the overtone, chase it down, and lock it in like your life depends on it. Learn where your part fits, and how to adjust when the ring isn't ringing. Sharpen your **ear** so you can tell the difference between "that's pretty good" and "did anyone else feel that in their *spine*?"

And don't sleep on **lyrics** and **tunes**—we're storytellers, not just note robots. Deliver the words with heart, shape the phrases with intention, and let the music do more than just exist—make it *move* people. Don't just mumble your way through a verse. Lyrics matter. They're not just placeholders between chords. Know what you're singing about. Feel it. Tell a story. Your audience will hear it when it's real. That's where the real magic is.

Finally, **craft**. Craft is what separates singers from artists. It's how you shape a phrase, choose a breath, and deliver a tag that makes the room go silent before they erupt in applause. It's care, skill, and a deep love for what you do.

So, as you head into this next month of rehearsals as we prepare for performances, ask yourself: Am I just hitting notes, or am I also lifting the room? Be the kind of singer people want to harmonize with—on stage and off.

Keep ringing those chords—and remember, 2 and 4 are your friends.


